Big Government is Back in Washington By Congressman Mike Turner, 3rd District



It's hard to imagine government getting any bigger or reaching any deeper into our pockets than the present Administration and Congress: A record projected budget deficit of \$2 trillion this year alone; the government take-over of a major American auto manufacturer and federal domination of our banking system; the ramrodding of a job-killing energy bill through the U.S. House; and the hasty drafting of a national health care plan that threatens to undermine access to the world's best medical care.

I opposed the \$700 billion government bailout late last year, and I also voted against the \$800 billion economic stimulus that passed the House in February. Neither of these poorly-considered spending bills was truly targeted to help the real victims of job loss and home foreclosures, and neither specifically indicated how the total \$1.5 trillion taxpayer investment would be spent. I also opposed the Cap and Trade energy bill, which passed the House in June, due to its failure to address energy needs of Ohio families, its negative impact upon our state's manufacturing base, and the additional job losses that would likely result.

President Obama now wants Congress to quickly pass a \$1 trillion national health care program that could reduce access to care to those who like their present coverage. The non-partisan Congressional Budget Office says the Democrat health care reform plan will not lower long term health costs. This is yet another rushed bill that could have serious consequences for the economy as taxes are placed on struggling small businesses to help pay for a government-run national health care system. The House could vote on government health care as soon as early September.

Against this backdrop of ever expanding government, I've introduced the "Preserving Capitalism in America" constitutional amendment (HJ Res 57). My constitutional amendment already has 103 congressional cosponsors, nearly a quarter of the House. If approved, my legislation would prohibit government ownership of private corporations, such as what we are seeing with General Motors. With Washington showing greater interest in maintaining its control over businesses, this amendment is needed to provide a wall of protection between our private enterprise system and the overreaching of big government.
